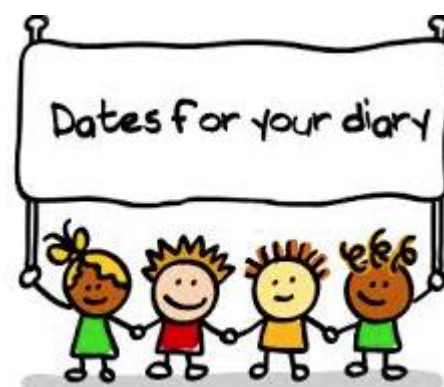

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Parking around School

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are writing to you today regarding a matter of urgent safety for our school community.

We fully appreciate that the ongoing roadworks in the area are making the morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up significantly more challenging. We understand the frustration of delays and the difficulty in finding a convenient spot.

However, we have received a number of concerned reports from community members and parents who feel that the current parking situation has become unsafe. The safety of our children and their families remains our absolute priority.

The Impact of inconsiderate parking when cars are parked on pavements, across driveways, or too close to junctions:

- Visibility is blocked: Drivers cannot see small children trying to cross the road.
- Pedestrians are forced into the road: Parents with prams and young children are being forced to walk in traffic because the pavement is blocked.
- Emergency access is restricted: In the event of an incident, emergency vehicles may not be able to pass through.

How you can help even with the roadworks, we must ask that all members of our community:

1. Avoid the "School Gates" crunch: If possible, park a few streets away where it is safer and walk the final five minutes ("Park and Stride").
2. Keep pavements clear: Please ensure there is enough room for a double-buggy to pass on the path.
3. Respect our neighbors: Avoid blocking private driveways, even "just for a minute."

We all want the same thing: for every child to arrive at school and get home again safely. We thank you for your patience and for your cooperation in keeping our roads safe during this period of disruption.



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
